Dear Parishioners

Fr Benedict and Fr Kingsley, on behalf of all our parishioners,
extend a very warm welcome to Father Francis Ututo on his return.

Today is World Mission Sunday, when we focus on the mission of
the Church, which is to bring the Good News to the whole world.
When we think of missionaries, we think of men and women who
have dedicated their lives to bringing the gospel to people in Third
World countries. But we are all missionaries, witnessing by our own
lives to the good news we have come to know in the Lord.

Gospel reflection:

The dynamic between Bartimaeus and Jesus is a perfect
description of what faith is: Bartimaeus heard Jesus, cried out to
him, persisted in his prayer, came to Jesus when he called, and
spoke boldly of his need. All these actions: hearing, crying out,
coming, speaking describe our Christian discipleship. We must let
our faith lead us to Jesus and then we must follow him. Without
persistence in prayer, it will be impossible for us to follow Jesus
faithfully on the road of self-giving. The encounter with Jesus in
prayer keeps our relationship with God healthy and strong. The
prayer of petition reminds us that disciples can do nothing on their
own without Jesus' help. At times we are doing our faith by reaching
out to those around us in need; at other times we are being our faith
by taking time to let our God be present to us in prayer.
